17. Narrative analysis II – analysis

Edexcel students: 'law and order' is a stated topic on your specification, and you have an explicit narrative analysis question in the exam. AQA students: 'law and order' is not a topic on your specification, although it was a problem the Homesteaders faced. However, you will meet a narrative analysis question in Paper 1, so it will do no harm to study this exercise.

In the Writing Development exercise #14 on Cattle-ranching, we looked at how to write a narrative, viz.:

- a) Plan out the events/developments you intend to describe, in the logical order, using subordinating conjunctions of time/sequence such as: 'First', 'Next', 'After', 'Before', 'Later', 'Initially', 'At last', 'Also', 'In addition', 'Meanwhile', 'Simultaneously', 'Furthermore'.
- b) Provide some relevant 'proving' information about the event/development.

Better essays, however, will ANALYSE the story as they tell it, by:

- a) explaining the importance of the event/development why it was a key event in the narrative.
- b) explaining how some events were linked how the story 'hangs together'.

Let's say you have to write the essay: "Write a narrative account analysing the attempts to establish law and order in the years c1876-c1895."

Consider the following table, which lists aspects of the attempts:
