## 5. Appositives

An appositive is a noun-phrase placed beside a noun to explain it more fully. It is a key tool in making your sentences more interesting and more concise; they are useful to convey a large amount of information in the minimum number of words.

You use an appositive to explain or expand an idea in the text.

You can frame an appositive using commas, but I tend to use brackets or en-dashes ('-') instead.

Consider the following sentence:

"The Hungarian Communist Rakosi described the process as 'slicing salami'."

On the webpage I was able to provide a hyperlink for anybody who doesn't know what that means. In an essay, however, you would need to explain it. You could do so in two sentences:

"The Hungarian Communist Rakosi described the process as 'slicing salami'. By this he meant gradually taking control of the different organs of government, and getting rid of all opposition, bit-by-bit."

But it is less clumsy to use an appositive, as I do on the webpage:

"The Hungarian Communist Rakosi described the process as 'slicing salami' – gradually taking control of the different organs of government, and getting rid of all opposition, bit-by-bit.."
